

They are a volunteer organisation based in Honiton whose aim is to bring about a community-wide response to dementia through raising awareness about what it is like to live with dementia and to positively encourage inclusivity in all aspects of community life. At the same time, the organisation offers valuable social support to those living with dementia and their carers.





# Dementia Friendly Honiton: Services and achievements

- Run a successful and well attended fortnightly Memory Café.
- Run a monthly, dementia friendly Nostalgic Cinema film show.
- Organised a regular Ambling Group for those with dementia and their carers.
- Built positive relationships and worked closely with local health and care services and the town, district and county councils.
- Garnered the active and continuing support of over 40 local businesses and organisations in the Honiton area; given the size and population of the area this is a notable achievement.
- Engaged closely with schools and youth groups to educate and inform the next generation and to engender inclusiveness and acceptance by the young of all those affected by dementia, directly or indirectly.
- Liaised with the local police to set-up the Herbert Protocol which helps the police in any search for a missing person. In this they are a leader in the field.
- Through working with Dementia UK and Dementia Friendly Honiton, raised the funds to appoint an Admiral Nurse for Honiton whose skills are specific to dementia and family support. The funds raised currently allow for six years' costs for the nurse and Fundraising is ongoing to cover further years.
- Honiton Dementia Action Alliance was named "Dementia Friendly Rural Community of the Year" in 2016 and in 2019 was honoured to receive the highly prestigious "Queens Award for Voluntary Organisations".

We run a **befriending** service to help those who are looking for company and companionship. Our volunteers are happy to visit people in their own homes and have a chat over a cup of tea. It may be that you have problems getting out and about and would just like someone to visit you in the comfort and security of your own home.

Our 'Time for You' service is aimed at giving Carers some time to themselves – whether to go shopping, read a book, or attend a weekly activity group - the choice is yours! Our trained volunteers are able to sit with those who need care for an hour or two a week, providing companionship for Our **Memory Café** is a place where those affected by memory loss can go, together with their Carers, to meet others and socialise. Very often activities will take place aimed at stimulating


