A30 Devon and Cornwall Ash Dieback

National Highways operates, maintains and improves England's motorways and major A roads.

In the South West we manage approx 8,800,000m² of woodland by the side of our roads, this equates to an area larger than Exmoor. Regular inspections of our woodlands are carried out by our tree specialists as part of our legal obligation to maintain a safe network.

Our recent survey along the A30 revealed a large number of trees suffering from Ash Dieback. We'll remove or otherwise make safe these trees and other dead or dying trees which pose a safety hazard to road users or adjoining property owners.

Our environmental experts will be available to make sure protected species are not harmed during this work.

The work will be carried out by our contractors, to British standards. Most sites are a single or small number of trees, and will be completed within one shift.

Where possible we will work during the day, but some overnight works (when traffic flows are at their lowest) may be necessary for the safety of our workforce and the travelling public. Please accept our apologies in advance for any disruption this may cause. Advance roadside warning signs will be in place prior to work beginning.
